## **Floodplain Construction Rules**

There are floodplain construction regulations to protect you and your neighbor.

Here is some basic guidance:

- → Call the Community Development Department at 360-345-2229 before you build or improve your structure, or alter the grade of your lot. You may be required by law to get a permit. Talk over what you want to do and make sure you can meet all the regulatory requirements.
- → Berms and other barriers that divert water onto other properties are prohibited. Play it safe and don't move dirt without a permit.

→ Call the Community Development Department if you see construction or filling without a permit.

An unpermitted project may increase flooding on your property.

Our floodplain regulations are in the Chapter 17.22 of the City's Municipal Code.

These rules only impact new development. They do not affect existing buildings unless the building will undergo a **substantial improvement**.

- → A substantial improvement is where the cost of the improvements, remodeling, or addition is more than 50% of the value of the building. A substantial improvement project must meet the construction standards for a new building in the Special Flood Hazard Area.
- → Repairs to a substantially damaged building that exceed 50% of the building's pre-damage value are considered substantial improvements. It does not matter if the building was damaged by a flood, fire, accident or other reason.

- → More detailed information on floodplain construction rules are found in FEMA's <u>Floodplain</u> <u>Management Requirements Study Guide and Desk Reference.</u> Note, though, that the City of Chehalis has some requirements that are more restrictive than these national guidelines.
