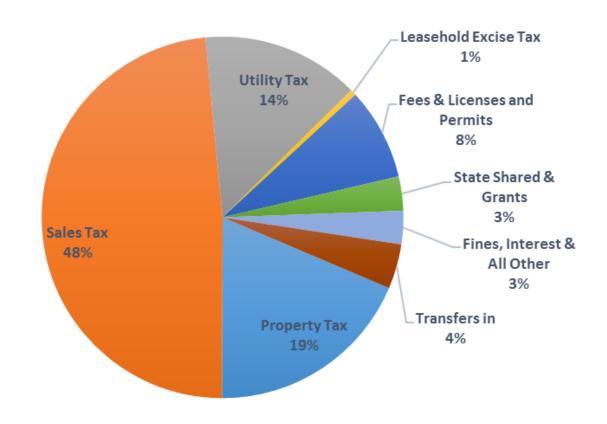

## The General Fund

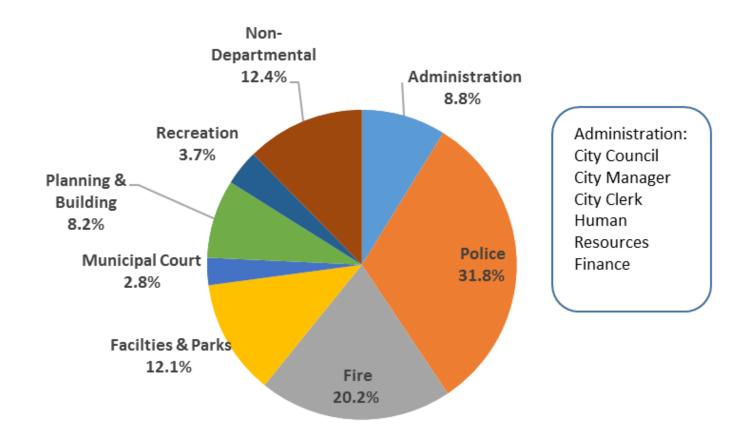
- ➤ Primary Operating Fund used for basic municipal services.
  - City Council; Administration (City Manager, City Clerk, Legal Service, Finance, and Human Resources); Police; Fire; Planning & Building; Public Works Facilities & Parks and Street Maintenance; Municipal Court; Recreation services
- Accounts for all financial resources except for those required or designated to be accounted for in another fund.
- Funding sources come from taxes, fees for services, state shared revenues, and other miscellaneous revenues.
  - Total tax revenues makes up 82% of the General Fund 2022 revenues.

## **Property Tax – Annual Levy Action**

- Council must set levy <u>every year</u> to support the cost of general government
- Increasing costs must be balanced by revenues
- City must identify all sources of revenues needed to fund programs including the amount of tax levy
- Most revenues are external to City control (i.e., sales tax, utility tax, etc.)- best estimate
- Property taxes may be increased on a limited basis with City Council approval

## **Property Tax – Levy Limit**

- Cities with a population of less than 10,000 can increase their levy amount by one percent without a vote (highest lawful levy calculation provided by County Assessor's Office)
- The statutory Maximum Regular Levy rate for the City of Chehalis is \$3.325 per \$1,000 AV. (\$3.60 plus \$0.225 fire pension levy minus \$0.50 library levy)
  - 2021 levy rate is \$1.999948 per \$1,000 AV
- Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Levy is up to \$0.50 per \$1,000/AV with voter approval.
  - 2021 EMS levy rate is \$0.40810 per \$1,000 AV
  - 2022 EMS levy rate will be reset at \$0.500 (current EMS levy expires 12/31/2021. In August 2021, Chehalis voters approved a 6-year renewal)

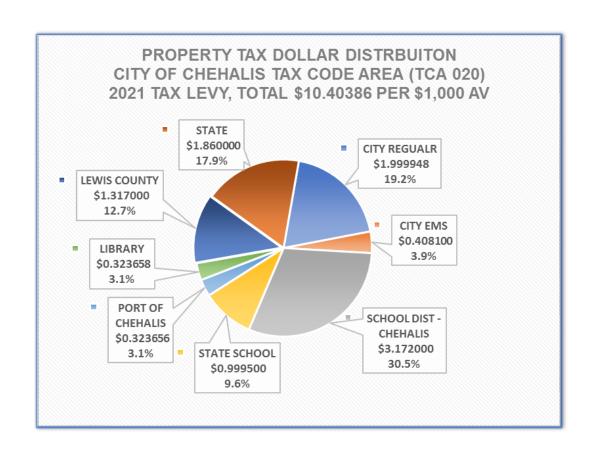
# Ordinance 1024-B, 2022 Property Tax Levy Proposed Increase Amount and Percentage

- Regular Levy
- 2021 Actual Levy **\$1,648,617.59**
- 1% Increase over 2021 Highest Lawful Levy is \$18,382.86 (excludes current year add-ons such as increase from new construction, state-assessed property, and administration refunds, etc.)
- Percentage increase over 2021 is 1.115047%

### EMS Levy

- 2021 Actual Levy \$336,409.23
- 2022 levy rate is \$0.50 per \$1,000 AV (Voter approved)
- 2022 Increase over 2021 is \$127,581.31
- Percentage increase of 37.924437%
- This applies to the City portion of the property tax. City of Chehalis has no control over the amounts levied by other agencies.

# Property Tax Distribution (Direct & Overlapping Rate)



Several taxing districts/agencies tax the same property

Tax Code Area 020 2021 total direct and overlapping levy rate is \$10.40386/\$1,000 AV

Chehalis taxing district (both Regular and EMS) share of typical property tax bill is about 23.1% (or \$2.4080/\$1000 AV)

## 2022 Property Tax Levy Amount (Ord. 1023-B)

RCW 84.52.020. City Council to certify tax levy amounts be collected in levy year. Levy Certification is filed with the county legislative body by November 30<sup>th</sup>.
