- an historical society or a committee to get historical home in a system.
- T. Baraconi said that is fine if 1 or 2 people want to help out at the museum. She
- also said that all 7 of them can volunteer together anywhere outside of this
- meeting and its purposes they can get together and create committees.
- P. Hammer said that the group can decide over the summer what to do in
- 55 October.

- J. McNaught said that she was thinking of having a committee to form bylaws for
- the commission.
- T. Baraconi suggested waiting to form bylaws after the council looks at the

- J. Kuehner said that maybe the City does not want an Historical committee.

- J. Kuehner said there have been 4 cancelled meetings, which have not been the
- fault of the members, and asked if maybe they need an assistant for Tammy.
- 73 T. Baraconi responded in informing the team that the City of Chehalis does have a
- new planner, but they are very behind in their work.
- 75 K. Smith asked if the mayor is aware of this situation.
- 76 T. Baraconi said that she assumes that he is aware.
- P. Hammer stated that since there were not anyone from the public present, that
- the commission needed to deliberate the ordinance either to adopt it, not
- 79 adopt it, or revise it.
- 30 J. McNaught motioned to change the ordinance back to having 7 commissioners.
- J. Six said that if they go down to 5, as the ordinance is proposed, a subcommittee
- would be 3 and that would be a Quorum.
- J. Six said he thinks staying at 7 members is better.

- P. Hammer asked T. Baraconi is they needed to vote on the ordinance tonight.
- T. Baraconi said that they do need to vote on it one way or the other.

- J. McNaught motioned to vote on the ordinance.
